PAEDS 1: 1 year old girl, right kidney mass.

PAEDS 2: 1 year old girl, left supraclavicular mass biopsy (known intra-abdominal mass).

PAEDS 3: 5 year old boy, liver mass.

PAEDS 4: Neonate, stoma reversal.

PAEDS 5: 15 year old boy, expansile lesion right maxilla.

PAEDS 6: 2 year old girl, right second toe nodule.

PAEDS 7: 2 year old boy, right kidney tumour.

PAEDS 8: Ex 25 week prem, now 29 weeks. Acute abdomen.

PAEDS 9: 11 year old boy, intraventricular brain tumour.

PAEDS 10: 5 day old girl, kidney mass.

PAEDS 11: 4 day old boy, abdominal distension. Failure to pass meconium.

PAEDS 12: 7 year old girl, lesion from thigh.

PAEDS 13: 3 year old girl, rectal bleeding ? juvenile polyposis.

PAEDS 14: 6 week old boy, jaundice, abnormal LFTs.

PAEDS 15: 9 year old boy, posterior fossa mass.

PAEDS 16: 6 year old boy, recurrent lip / gingival swelling, and oral mucosal tags. Intraoral bx.

PAEDS 17: 11 year old boy, orbital mass.

PAEDS 18: 11 year old boy, scapula mass.

PAEDS 19: 8 week old boy, abnormal LFTs.

PAEDS 20: 2 year old boy, diarrhoea, fever, lung mass. Colonic biopsy.

PAEDS 21: 7 mth old girl, scaly purpuric rash torso, axilla, scalp.

PAEDS 22: 1 year old boy, renal mass.

PAEDS 23: 17 year old girl, forearm nodule.

PAEDS 24: Newborn male, mass over thenar eminence.

PAEDS 25: 1 year old boy, axillary lump.

PAEDS 26: 12 year old boy, painful lesion middle phalanx, index finger.
